


renowned author and dolphin expert Dr. Horace Dobbs is giving a presentation at the Riverside building whilst launching his new book, the sixth in a series of stories

The book is aimed at children and adults alike and introduces readers to the undersea world of the dolphin.





### Dilo - New Adventures

**Dilo** is off on his adventures again. Ever since Dilo in Lighthouse Bay was published in 2006 fans have been clamouring for the next book. Well they certainly won't be disappointed with this latest epic dolphin tale by master story teller Horace Dobbs.

### Cleverly educational and hugely entertaining

Dilo's latest escapades begin when he meets a wise old turtle named Tina.


"I know a place you can go to for an adventure," she tells him. "It's called the Isle of the Gods. But beware. It's beautiful but it is also dangerous."

Just as Dilo is about to set off on his journey, a fish with a suction pad on its head, called a remora, decides it would like to join him for a free ride. And sticks herself firmly to the dolphin. Try as he might Dilo can't get rid of his unwanted passenger. Eventually, he resigns himself to the fact that he is stuck with Rema, as she calls herself. Thereafter it becomes a Pinochio/Jiminy Cricket relationship. Rema wants a peaceful life. But Dilo's zest for new experiences knows no bounds.

Here's how Horace describes the duo's encounter with two feeding humpback whales:

The fish were trapped by the bubble curtain as if it was a net. Dilo was not frightened by the bubbles. He swam into the bubble net with the fish. Beneath Dilo the second whale was rushing upwards. Its huge mouth was open wide. It was moving faster and faster. "Are you mad?" screamed Rema. The dolphin didn't hear. He was too excited. Suddenly Dilo could feel himself being pushed upwards by the water in front of the speeding whale. The dolphin was surrounded by a mass of writhing fish. There was mayhem all around him. Dilo heard an anguished cry. It was Rema.

"I don't want to die. I don't want to be eaten by a whale."



At the last minute Dilo jumps out of danger of course. This is a typical example of what Bernard Eaton, publisher of DIVER magazine, describes as: A wonderful introduction to the underwater world and its wealth and wonders. Dilo and the Isle of the Gods is cleverly educational as well as hugely entertaining. It is beautifully illustrated by Richard Oldfield, universally known as Rico, whose pictures appeal to children and adults alike.

Although written for kids this aspect of the Dilo books makes them very popular with adults – especially divers. Indeed, the entire Dilo series is based on Horace's enormous wealth of undersea adventures – especially with dolphins.

The Dilo books are written in an easy-to read style for children age 7-11. Reviews indicate that these enthralling adventure tales are also greatly enjoyed by adults who often find some surprising facts hidden within them.

The books are illustrated throughout with black and white pen drawings in his inimitable style by highly acclaimed marine artist Rico Oldfield.

Although the books follow a sequence each one is a complete story in itself and can be read separately.

The first book in the series, *Dilo and the Call of the Deep*, introduces Dilo the dolphin. Dilo's mother looses her companions in a mysterious tragedy. She brings up Dilo on her own. Her son becomes her best friend. The book reveals the joys and perils of the undersea world as seen through the eyes and mind of a curious, mischievous young dolphin.

*Dilo Makes Friends* sees the arrival of "The Terrible Twins", Robin and Debra, to spend a holiday with their uncle Pat, Boka his dog, Sprat his cat. And Postie - the postman. After a frightening start Debra develops a very close friendship with Dilo the dolphin who swims beneath the lighthouse where the children are staying.

What happens when humans get gold fever is the theme for *Dilo and the Treasure Hunters*. Dilo gets into dire peril when villains use explosives to get at sunken treasure.

In *Dilo and the Witch of Black Rock* the reader finds out what it feels like for a dolphin, accustomed to being free in the open sea, to be captured and imprisoned in a dolphinarium. After his release by the Terrible Twins Dilo meets up with them again in *Dilo in Lighthouse Bay* where a fire on a huge oil rig puts him in mortal danger.

When his mother dies, Dilo wants to go with her into the next world. The ghost dolphins who come to escort her tell Dilo he can't go. He has a mission. And that is why he has a star on his dorsal fin.

At night when Dilo sees the Dolphin Constellation of stars in the heavens he knows that the spirit of his mother is always with him wherever he goes.

The series of Dilo books can be enjoyed separately. Each book is illustrated throughout in black and white by Rico.

### Dolphins in the Humber – you must be joking!

When local businessman, Ian Scruton sat looking out of his office window at the Riverside building the last thing he expected to see was a family of dolphins swimming past.

His office at the Riverside building may afford some of the most spectacular views of the River Humber the city has to offer, but few would expect the murky looking water to be home to such magnificent creatures. This is what prompted Ian to contact North Ferriby based dolphin expert, Dr. Horace Dobbs who was delighted to hear the news.

Dr. Dobbs was invited to visit the building and quickly realised that the stunning panoramic views would make it the ideal location from which to undertake vital conservation research. Employees at the building were invited to attend a special presentation by Dr. Dobbs where he encouraged them to jot down notes of their sightings to provide valuable data for the local Sea Watch Survey of whales and dolphins.

Ian Scruton, Managing Director Scruton & Co the company behind the Riverside building said: "People laughed at me when I told them I'd seen dolphins swimming past the office, they thought I'd imagined it. I was relieved when Horace confirmed this was possible and he said it was a sign that the river is healthy because porpoises and dolphins are opportunistic creatures who go wherever there they can catch a lot of fish."

Dr Dobbs gives entertaining and amusing presentations about how he was persuaded to give up orthodox medical research to explore why humans have such an affinity with dolphins. Today he is a world leader in the field and his work takes him all over the globe where he uses the healing powers of dolphins to help children with special needs such as autism.

Horace said, "I'm delighted that Ian got in touch. It's very important that people take an interest in the wildlife all around us and it still surprises me that so many people who live locally have no idea that porpoises and seals regularly visit the River Humber. It's excellent that they've been seen again, it's a great indicator of the productivity and health of the river."

Money will be raised at the Book Launch for Dr. Dobbs' non-profit organisation, International Dolphin Watch, which encourages youngsters to take part in dolphin activities, and has close links with the registered charity, Operation Sunshine Family Therapy Programmes, that offers children and young adults with severe mental disadvantages the opportunity to fulfil their dreams of swimming with dolphins and brings joy and healing to special needs families. Dr. Horace Dobbs is Patron of this charity.






### Theatrical Premiere of the film SAVING LUNA
